County College of Morris will host a Post Election Panel Discussion from 1 to 3 p.m., Thursday, Nov. 16 in the Student Community Center, Davidson Room. Admission is free. The keynote speaker and member of the panel is Professor Ingrid Reed of the Eagleton Institute at Rutgers University. The panel will also consist of Christina Ramirez, Executive Director of the Morris County Republican Committee; Horace Chamberlain, former mayor of Jefferson Township and member of the Morris County Democratic Committee; CCM Student Government President Alexandrina Garcia-Verdin, representing young Democrats; and another CCM student to be announced later, representing young Republicans.

Reed directs the Eagleton New Jersey Project, an initiative designed to reinforce and expand the contributions of the Rutgers Eagleton Institute of Politics to the governance and politics of its home state. Among its initiatives are programs on campaign and election activity, women and politics, welfare reform and governance issues.

## **World Aids Day recognition**

CCM will recognize World AIDS Day with a presentation by Elaine Pasqua. She will speak about "*Sex and Excess, Surviving the Party*" at 11:30 a.m. on Monday, Nov. 20 in DeMare Hall, Room C 121.

A professed survivor of sex, drugs, and rock and roll, Elaine shares stories of individuals whose lives were changed by what seemed to be an inconsequential decision. She wants her audiences to understand that good people sometimes make bad choices. The main objective of this program is to encourage participants to think about long term consequences before they engage in high-risk behaviors, and to come up with alternative plans. Students learn to base their decisions on facts rather than emotions, to empower themselves to hold their ground, and to communicate effectively with their peers. Elaine challenges her audiences to confront their own behavior choices and learn to party responsibly and with respect towards one another. Through this dynamic and entertaining program, students realize they can maintain their personal and academic goals as their top priority, yet still have fun in college.
