The Youngtown receives Gold Medal Honor

The Youngtown Edition newspaper received Gold Medalist standing by the Columbia Scholastic Press Association (CSPA). This is the third time in seven years that CCM's student newspaper has received a gold medal. The judging was based on spring 2007 papers.

The CSPA judge and award student publications throughout the world. All schools enrolled in the program receive a 20-page written evaluation.

Every student publication is evaluated by a judge, working alone, but following the standards that all CSPA newspaper judges must follow.

Among the grades received in overall coverage, *The Youngtown* was awarded 95 out of 100 points. News coverage received a grade of 47 out of 50, feature coverage 49 out of 50, sports coverage 45 out of 50, and opinion coverage 48 out of 50.

The Youngtown came extremely close to receiving All-Columbian honors.

In order to be considered a Gold Medalist, the CSPA must issue a numerical score of 925-1,000 by adding up points in a number of different categories. The categories include coverage, writing and editing, graphic presentation and business operations. Silver Medalists must have a score of 850-924 and bronze medalists are below 849 points. *The Youngtown Edition* received a score of 945.
