The Dance Program at CCM is an ideal preparation for transferring into a four-year college or university dance program with rigorous training in ballet, modern dance, choreography, performance, dance history and body sciences.

WHY STUDY DANCE AT CCM?

Students enrolled in the Dance Program have the opportunity to study in a state-of-the-art studio lab equipped with cutting-edge video technology, premiere audio equipment and resilient flooring. With a small faculty-to-student ratio, students receive generous individual attention to aid in mastery of their craft. Students pursue varied performance opportunities in both the Music Technology Building Performance Lab and the Student Community Center Auditorium.

The Dance Program faculty are artist educators who are active in the dance field as performers and choreographers.

Students who earn an Associate of Fine Arts (AFA) degree in Dance from CCM generally transfer to a four-year college or university to earn a bachelor's degree. Dance majors prepare audition materials for selected Bachelor of Fine Arts dance departments in their final year of study at CCM.
