The Associate of Science Degree in Early Childhood Education at CCM is an excellent starting point for those pursuing teacher certification. Students can transfer to earn a Bachelors Degree in Early Childhood Education and/or Elementary Education. This foundation prepares students to become preK-3 and/or K-6 teachers in public and private sectors. Many students also elect to pursue Special Education Certification upon transfer.

Early Childhood Education is a multidisciplinary field. Candidates develop theoretical and practical knowledge in areas such as child development, humanities, mathematics, technology, social sciences, biological sciences, the arts and multicultural/global perspectives.

The Early Childhood Program provides outstanding instruction and experiential learning to prepare students for advanced study and childhood related careers in a diverse and changing world.
