If You See Something, Say Something

The U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) [“If You See Something, Say Something”](#) program helps to further increase the public’s awareness of how to recognize and report suspicious activity throughout the year. This national campaign raises public awareness of the indicators of terrorism-related crime, and the importance of reporting suspicious activity.

Suspicious Activity Reporting

Whenever you feel uncomfortable or concerned about activity on campus you can call the Public Safety Department, 973-328-5550. The additional eyes and ears, as well as an astute understanding of why security procedures are in place creates a safer campus. The workplace is just one area where practicing safe habits can make an impact. Mindful safe practices in the workplace transfer to your community.

Recognizing suspicious activity and the early warning signs of someone who may be in crisis is the first step. The next step is reporting it to authorities. The Sandy Hook Promise Foundation created a PSA that re-enforces the importance of recognizing the signs.
