Science courses completed prior to entering the program must be less than seven years old. If the science courses exceed the seven-year limit, students must prove their competency by testing, or they must retake the courses. This includes the Exercise Science core courses as well.

The A.S. in Public Health is a transfer degree leading to a B.S. degree or higher in Public Health and Public Health Education. Public Health occupations include: Health Educators, Epidemiologists, Environmental Science and Protection Technicians, Medical and Health Service Managers, Environmental Scientists and Specialists, and Occupational Health and Safety Specialists.
