MATHEMATICS: Choose a 3/4 credit General Education Math elective from the approved course list.

- If you choose MAT 120, Math for the Liberal Arts, it will require one non-credit Basic Algebra course or a passing score on Algebra Accuplacer, ACT, SAT equivalencies or a review of Math courses on the High School transcript – for recent graduates only.
- All other General Education Math classes (besides MAT 120) will require a minimum of two non-credit Basic and Intermediate Algebra courses or a passing score on Accuplacer Algebra, ACT, SAT equivalencies or a review of Math courses on the High School transcript – for recent graduates only.

FIRE SCIENCE/CRIMINAL JUSTICE RESTRICTED ELECTIVES:

Choose 21 credits from the following – all courses are 3-credits, unless otherwise noted.

FST 201 Fire Prevention and Related Codes, FST 205 Fire Investigation, FST 207 Emergency Medical Technician Basic (6 credits), CJS 140 Basic Emergency Telecommunicator, CJS 141 Basic Emergency Medical Dispatch, CJS 215 Investigative Function, CJS 201 Emergency Services Management, CJS 205 Disaster Response and Recovery, CJS 226 (1 CR), 227 (2 CR) 228 - Internship Work Experience – Criminal Justice, CJS 231 Domestic and International Terrorism. Other CJS courses may be applicable, but you must have prior approval from your academic advisor.

RESTRICTED ELECTIVE CREDIT MAY BE AWARDED: Work with the Department Chairperson to:

- Receive credit for HED 283 Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) - A current American Heart Association (A.H.A) card is required.
- Receive credit for FST 101 Introduction to Fire Science & FST 102 Fire Prevention & Related Codes – Fire Fighter I certificate is required.
- Receive credit for CJS 140 Basic Emergency Telecommunicator & CJS 141 Basic Emergency Dispatch – Taking the NJ State Emergency Medical Dispatch and The Emergency Telecommunicator courses.
- Review external courses/certifications you have obtained as they may be used for additional college credit.

HONORS COURSES: You may be eligible to take honors courses. Discuss this option with your Academic Advisor.
