***Students are required to take either two sequential language courses or two literature courses (see reverse side for Gen. Ed. course selection). For transfer, students who have completed two years of a language in high school must begin at the intermediate level of that language.

Teacher Education Core Note:

To enroll and remain in the Teacher Education Program students must maintain a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher.

To enroll in EDU 111 and EDU 211 students must have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher and permission from the Department Chairperson, Assistant Chairperson, or advisor (via petition).

MATHEMATICS: Recommended Courses: MAT 124 Statistics or MAT 130 Probability and Statistics. Students must select at least one three-credit Math course, although a four-credit Math class may work best to meet the 12-credit requirement for Math/Science/Technology. **Note:** Students will not receive credit towards graduation for more than one of the following courses: MAT 124, Statistics and MAT 130, Probability and Statistics.

LABORATORY SCIENCE: See General Education course list (Science). You must choose at least one 4-credit Laboratory Science elective.

TECHNOLOGY LITERACY: If you pass the Technology Literacy Competency Placement exam, you are not required to take a Technology course although you may do so if you choose. If you do not pass the exam, you must take 1-4 credits of General Education Technology. Consult the General Education course list for choices.

ENG 250 American Literature from Civil War to 20th Century

ENG 247 Major British Writers of the 19th and 20th Century

OR

Language (6 CR): Select any two of the same foreign language courses in sequence.

Spanish: SPN

Arabic: ARA

Italian: ITL

Japanese: JPN

AND

One, (3 CR) course from the General Education course list (Humanities).

HISTORY (6 CR): Any two-part sequence of the following:
