



Spring Registration





Campus Crimes, Fires and Other Emergencies Activity Report (PL2015, Chapter 220, S485) in accordance with N.J.S.A.C. 18A:3B-71: There were **no** criminal incidents; **no** fires or emergencies for the period of November 1, 2025 – November 30, 2025.
