WHAT YOU WILL LEARN

The International Studies Program is for students with career goals in the fields of international affairs, diplomacy, world languages and cultures, teaching, and research, among many other fields.

The mission of the International Studies Program at County College of Morris (CCM) is to provide students with the general education course work and global perspective needed to transfer to a similar program at a four-year college. In addition to general education courses, students are required to take courses in culture, geography, world literature, and four semesters of a world language.

WHY STUDY INTERNATIONAL STUDIES AT CCM?

Students enrolled in the International Studies Program have the opportunity to study abroad to enhance their course work. CCM, through its membership in the College Consortium for International Studies (CCIS), offers students the opportunity to study in seventeen countries.
