
High-fidelity simulators are used in the Nursing Laboratory to provide realistic, hands-on "patient" experiences to students in a safe environment.

PROGRAM STRUCTURE

There are two phases to the Nursing program at CCM.

Pre-professional

- > Typically completed in two to four semesters
- Includes general education and science courses

Professional

- > Admission by separate "professional phase" application
- > Acceptance determined by grades in pre-professional phase
- > Nursing core courses are completed sequentially in four semesters. Two years to complete.

The Nursing Program at CCM is a competitive-based admissions program. A separate application is required for acceptance into the Professional Phase of Nursing. Acceptance is based on grades achieved in the preprofessional phase.

WHERE YOU CAN GO!

Our graduates receive an Associate in Applied Science and are eligible to take the National Council Licensure Examination for Registered Nurses (NCLEX-RN). The NJ Board of Nursing licenses registered nurses (RNs). Licensure requirements include: Application completion, passing the NCLEX-RN and Criminal History Background Checks. After passing the NCLEX-RN, our graduates are prepared for entry-level employment as an RN in a variety of settings and specialty areas.

Nurses are committed to lifelong learning, and we highly recommend that all graduates seek their BSN. A BSN is not required to practice nursing in NJ, but it will lead to more opportunities for employment and growth within the profession. Credits from the CCM Nursing Program are readily transferable towards a four year nursing degree (BSN) at many state and private colleges and universities. Some four year institutions may offer an accelerated path from an RN to master's degree in nursing. This may be a good option for those who already have a bachelor's degree in another major and an AAS in Nursing. CCM is proudly partnering with the following programs:


