STEP 1: Review Your Letter of Admission

Your Letter of Admission includes important information, such as your CCM Student Identification Number, your Program of Study/Major and any Placement Tests you may need to take before you can register for courses.

STEP 2: Financial Planning

It is very important to understand the cost of attending CCM to ensure you can fund your education. As a degree/certificate seeking student, you may be eligible for Financial Aid. You should complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) as soon as possible to secure any funding that may be available. Visit www.fafsa.gov to complete the FAFSA.

STEP 3: Take CCM's Placement Test or Submit Exemptions

Placement tests (or suitable exemptions) are required for all degree-seeking students and for some certificates. Most recent high school graduates (2020 or 2021) will be assessed for placement using their high school transcript. Information regarding any required placement tests and how to schedule them can be found on your letter of admission.

If you have the minimum required score on the SAT, ACT, PARCC exams, or have specific transfer of credit, you may also be exempt from CCM's placement tests. Once you have been deemed exempt or completed your placement tests, you will then receive information about advising and registration.

STEP 4: Schedule a New Student Advisement and Registration Session

The Admissions office will send you an email with information on how to schedule an appointment for advisement and registration for the upcoming semester once you have been deemed exempt or have completed your placement tests.

STEP 5: Join Us for New Student Orientation

Once you have registered for courses, you will receive an invitation, sent to your CCM student email, to attend a New Student Orientation, also known as FYI: First Year Information. The FYI program will focus on, among other things, acquainting you with different departments and services that will be especially helpful to you as a new CCM student.

STEP 6: Submit Your Immunization Records

Immunization records are required for all full time, degree-seeking students. Send your immunization records to the Health Services office via mail or fax. You will receive information on how to set up your CCM student email in an email sent from the Admissions office to your personal email after you complete placement testing. There also will be a link to access the Google login portal. Enter the information provided in the email to access your account.

TITANS DIRECT

YOUR CCM ID CARD

The CCM ID Photo serves as your primary form of identity verification throughout the college and you are required to submit a photo of yourself to the Office of Campus Life. The image will be added to your Titans Direct account. When your CCM ID is ready to be picked up on campus, you will receive an email with instructions for picking up your CCM ID. All students are required to wear a college-issued identification badge on campus.

PARKING AT CCM

Register for your free parking pass online at www.ccm.edu/public-safety/.

Once you have completed the CCM Online Motor Vehicle Registration, you can pick up your parking pass at the Office of Public Safety located near Parking Lot 10. Make sure you have your CCM ID and your vehicle registration with you

FINANCIAL AID

CHARGEBACKS

Chargebacks are a process created by the State of New Jersey so out-of-county students are not penalized with higher or additional tuition costs for attending an out-of-county college if their home county college does not offer their chosen program of study/major. Students should inquire about chargebacks early in the enrollment process. Each college has different deadlines and cutoff dates to apply for chargebacks and submission of paperwork. Chargebacks must be initiated each semester. For more information, visit
