

**ARTICULATION AGREEMENT  
BETWEEN  
BLOOMSBURG UNIVERSITY OF PENNSYLVANIA  
and  
COUNTY COLLEGE OF MORRIS OF NEW JERSEY**

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into this 21<sup>st</sup> day of October, 2013, between Bloomsburg University of Pennsylvania of the State System of Higher Education and the County College of Morris, Randolph, NJ.

NOW THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the foregoing and the mutual promises hereinafter expressed and intending to be legally bound hereby, the Parties agree as follows:

**A. INTRODUCTION**

Bloomsburg University of Pennsylvania and the County College of Morris, through their respective Departments of Exercise Science, agree to establish this articulation agreement whereby students who complete the requirements for an Associate in Science Degree in Health and Exercise Science at the County College of Morris may enter the fifth semester of the Bachelor of Science Degree program in Exercise Science at Bloomsburg University of Pennsylvania. The purposes of this agreement are:

1. To cooperatively provide a program of study consisting of a sequence of courses following a logical progression toward the Bachelor of Science in Exercise Science.
2. To enable qualified graduates of the County College of Morris to build upon their education and training by earning a baccalaureate degree.
3. To enable Bloomsburg University of Pennsylvania to attract a more diverse population of students to the Exercise Science program.
4. To enable community college graduates to obtain a quality education at a low cost, and, in doing so, provide the Commonwealth with qualified exercise science practitioners.

**B. PROCEDURES**

The County College of Morris (hereinafter referred to as "CCM") agrees to publicize this articulation agreement to prospective students in CCM's admissions literature and as part of regular student recruitment, and inform qualified students matriculating at CCM of the opportunity for admission to Bloomsburg University of Pennsylvania under the terms of this agreement. The following items are the responsibility of students participating in the articulation program:

1. Successfully complete the coursework specified on the Articulation Agreement.
2. Apply for admission and pay application fee to Bloomsburg University of Pennsylvania by January 1, of the year in which they plan to enroll in the fall semester.
3. At the time of application, provide high school transcripts and transcripts of all college courses taken up to and including the previous fall semester.
4. Upon receiving the Associate in Science degree from CCM and prior to registering at Bloomsburg University of Pennsylvania, students are responsible for providing complete CCM transcripts to Bloomsburg University of Pennsylvania.
5. Students must pay Bloomsburg University of Pennsylvania tuition and fees for those semesters in which they are attending Bloomsburg University of Pennsylvania.

6. A maximum of 60 credits will be accepted from CCM of their total credit requirement of 63 for Exercise Science Majors. Credits earned at a college or institution which does not hold accreditation by "Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools/Commission on Higher Education" or its regional equivalent, will not transfer. At least 60 semester hours of credit toward graduation must be in courses taken at an accredited four-year degree-granting institution. At least 30 of the last 45 semester hours credited toward a bachelor degree must be earned at Bloomsburg University of Pennsylvania. At least 50% of courses in the major discipline must be earned at Bloomsburg University of Pennsylvania.

## **B. CONDITIONS OF THE AGREEMENT**

1. The Coordinator of the Bachelor of Science degree program in Exercise Science at Bloomsburg University of Pennsylvania and the Coordinator of the Associate of Health and Exercise Science degree program at CCM will monitor compliance with the terms of this agreement.
2. The term of this agreement shall be five years commencing when all applicable signatures are obtained.
3. Either institution may withdraw from the Agreement upon written notification of the other, except that commitments already in effect for students who have applied to Bloomsburg University of Pennsylvania will be honored. In the event of a substantial breach, such as, a lack of response to requests for information and a lack of adequate participation, either party may terminate this agreement.
4. The relationship of the parties to this contract shall not be construed to constitute a partnership, joint venture, or any other relationship, other than that of independent contractors.
5. Neither of the parties shall assume any liabilities as a result of this agreement. As to liability to each other or death to persons, or damages to property, the parties do not waive any defense as a result of entering into this contract. Neither of the parties shall assume any liabilities as a result of this agreement. As to liability to each other or death to persons, or damages to property, the parties do not waive any defense as a result of entering into this contract. This provision shall not be construed to limit the parties' rights, claims or defenses which arise as a matter of law pursuant to any provisions of this contract. To the extent either party is granted sovereign immunity under their respective state laws or federal law, this provision shall not be construed to limit the sovereign immunity of either party, including the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and the State System of Higher Education.
6. This agreement represents the entire understanding between the parties. This agreement can be modified only in writing with the same formality as the original agreement.
