<p><u>Communications</u> (6 cr) English Composition I and II Note: CCM students will be asked to take a two credit research writing course after transferring to satisfy Drew's writing requirement. Students may petition for exemption by following Drew's exemption procedures.</p>	
<p><u>Humanities</u> ((15 cr) 2 semesters in a foreign language Suggested humanities electives: courses in philosophy (highly recommended), art, music, literature, speech, or theater</p>	
<p><u>Social Science</u> (21 cr) SOC 120/Principles of Sociology SOC 202/Contemporary Social Issues PSY 113/General Psychology History Sequence (2 courses) Social Science Electives: (chose courses similar in title and content to those in the Drew University catalog)</p>	
<p><u>Mathematics & Science</u> (10-12 cr) Meet CCM's requirements but keep the following in mind: MATH 113, MATH 124 or MATH 131 are good choices for ease of transfer. (Statistics is highly recommended for social science majors.) If the student wishes to take computer science, CMP 113 and 220 are recommended.</p>	
<p><u>Diversity/Global Perspective</u> (3 cr) If possible, use this course to also meet Drew's language in context requirement. * Depending on the foreign language studied, CCM courses meeting this requirement are History of Modern East Asia, History of Early Modern Europe, History of Modern Europe, Latin American History, Modern Middle East, History of the Jewish People. Also Western Art History I and II and music history courses.</p>	
<p><u>Electives</u> (6 cr): begin to take courses towards the major or minor. Choose courses similar in title and content to courses listed in current Drew University catalog.</p>
