### Program to Program - Guaranteed Transfer Agreement between

**Teacher Education: Mathematics Track Associate in Science Degree  
from the County College of Morris and the**

**Bachelor of Arts, Secondary Education with a Second Major in Mathematics at Rider University**

In the interest of providing the County College of Morris students with improved opportunities to excel in higher education, Rider University (Rider) and the County College of Morris (CCM) agree to create a Program to Program **Guaranteed Transfer Agreement** between the **Teacher Education: Mathematics Track**, Associate in Science Program at CCM and the Bachelor of Arts in **Secondary Education with a Second Major in Mathematics** at Rider University.

1. Rider University will guarantee transfer admission, the waiver of application fee; acceptance of all credits earned with a grade of C or better (C+ for Education Courses) that count toward the Associate degree in the **Teacher Education: Mathematics Track** Program and meet Rider University equivalents; and full junior status to all graduates in good standing of the **Teacher Education: Mathematics Track** Associate in Science Degree at the County College of Morris.

Rider University admission will be granted to students who have fulfilled the following criteria:

- A. Declared their participation in this program while enrolled at CCM by completing the Intent to Enroll Form. Students are encouraged to submit their application to the program before they have completed 30 credits at CCM in order to maximize the efficiency of their transfer to Rider University. Rider further agrees that we will accept the County College of Morris student up to 45 credits; but prior to completion of the last semester at CCM.
  - B. Followed the appropriate transfer program of prescribed selections for Rider while at CCM, listed in the **Teacher Education: Mathematics Track** Program to Program – Transfer Advising Guide.
  - C. Graduated with their Associate degree at CCM.
  - D. Earned a cumulative grade point average of at least a 2.75.
  - E. Applied for transfer admission by the normal Rider transfer application deadline.
2. This agreement between the County College of Morris and Rider goes into effect immediately upon receipt of the signatures of each institution.
  3. This agreement shall be subject to review and renewal every five years.


4. The County College of Morris will provide its students with full information about the Program to Program - Guaranteed Transfer Admission Program that falls under the overall Guaranteed Transfer Agreement with Rider and CCM. Students under this Program to Program Agreement will be eligible for the benefits outlined in the Rider-CCM overall Guaranteed Transfer Agreement.
5. Students who declare their intent to participate will work directly with CCM counseling and advising staff to obtain assistance with course selections which fulfill Rider's requirements.
6. CCM will provide Rider with the names and contact information of students who have enrolled in the Program to Program – Guaranteed Transfer Agreement Program and Rider will establish communication with the participating students. Students will provide this information and permission to share information when they complete the CCM-Rider Guaranteed Transfer Admission Intent to Enroll Form.
7. The regular process for transfer admission to Rider will remain for CCM students who do not participate in this program, as well as for program participants who do not fulfill the requirements listed in Article 1 of this document.
8. Rider University is committed to making our educational opportunities as affordable as possible. With scholarship and financial aid, transfer students often find Rider's private education is comparable to attending a public college or university. The CCM transfer student, who holds a GPA of 2.50 to 4.00 on college-level work, is eligible upon the submission of a full-time student application, for consideration for transfer scholarship and grants. In addition, for those students of Phi Theta Kappa (PTK) at the County College of Morris, the student may be eligible to receive an annual renewable scholarship. 9. CCM students, following completion of the CCM-Rider Guaranteed Transfer Admission Intent to Enroll Form, have the option to take a course at Rider that counts toward the Rider degree at no charge. The course may be taken following completion of 30 college-level credits at CCM and prior to the time period before their matriculation with Rider University. The designated course (s) requires a grade of "C" or better and allows the CCM student to experience first-hand the academic environment at Rider. **The course credit options are: EDE-200-Effective Classroom Management (3).**



**Rider University Footnotes:**

As of September 1, 2015 the New Jersey Department of Education requires students to take and pass all sections of the Praxis – The Core Academic Skills for Educators Test (Test Code 5751) prior to formal entry into a teacher preparations program.

U – Students have a number of options to satisfy this requirement; courses will be evaluated on an individual basis. CCM students interested in the College of Continuing Studies should contact that division directly.

A – Student must earn a grade of “C+” in all Education courses for transfer.

Education students are required to earn a GPA of 3.00+ prior to student teaching.

o For transfer credit County College of Morris students must earn a grade of “C” or higher in all non-education courses. (Not transfer credit will be accepted for any course with a grade of “C- “or below.)

Students are required to select a second major in a Liberal Arts & Sciences discipline.

B -The Mathematics Major is required to take the following courses. (MTH-210; MTH-211; MTH-212; MTH-240; MTH-250; MTH-308; MTH-315; MTH-340; MTH-401 & MTH-410) Furthermore the mathematics major must maintain a “B” average in Calculus I (MTH-210) and Calculus II (MTH-211). Plus, three upper level mathematics electives of PHY-200/PHY-200L; PHY-201/PHY-201L.)
