Articulation Agreement

Rutgers, The State University of New Jersey Faculty of Arts and Sciences-Newark & County College of Morris

Purpose

The purpose of this agreement is to enable students who graduate from County College of Morris with an Associate of Arts (A.A.) degree to continue their education and obtain a B.A. in Journalism from Rutgers University College-Newark as part of the Rutgers-County College of Morris Partnership in Higher Education off-campus initiative.

Transferring Credits from County College of Morris

Students completing the A.A. in Liberal Arts degree from County College of Morris may transfer 63 credits towards a B.A. in Journalism. Graduates of other County College of Morris programs will have their transcripts evaluated for necessary lower-level major requirements.

Rutgers University College-Newark, Journalism Requirements

Rutgers University College-Newark's B.A. in Journalism requires a total of 124 credits, a minimum of 39 credits in the Journalism major, 38 credits of University College-Newark's Core Curriculum, and 47 credits of additional courses, including the completion of a minor as specified in Newark's Core Curriculum, to bring the total to 124 credits. See attached Articulation Degree Plan (Attachment A).

By following County College of Morris's A.A. curriculum as defined in the attached Articulation Degree Plan, students can transfer 63 credits to Rutgers University College-Newark's Journalism program.

- Courses transferring to University College-Newark must have a grade of "C" or better in each course in the major.
- A maximum of 24 credits in Journalism courses may be transferred into the Journalism program.
- A minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.0 is required for admission into Rutgers, The State University of New Jersey, University College-Newark's Journalism program. Students with less than a 3.0 will be reviewed on an individual basis.
- Completion of a County College of Morris A.A. degree that is compliant with the Comprehensive Statewide Transfer Agreement will meet the Core Curriculum requirements for Rutgers University College-Newark, as stipulated by the Comprehensive Statewide Transfer Agreement.
- Any change in the curriculum of County College of Morris or Rutgers University College-Newark's Journalism program will require a review of this agreement by both programs.

Special Conditions

- Under the policies of the cooperative agreement, County College of Morris is responsible for providing 100- and 200-level courses, and Rutgers, The State University of New Jersey is responsible for providing the 300- and 400-level courses.
- As County College of Morris does not offer two lower-level courses required for the Journalism degree, this program necessitates an exception to the agreement. Since two requirements of the major at the 200-level are unavailable from County College of Morris, Rutgers is permitted to provide six credits of lower-level courses not currently available at County College of Morris: Introduction to Media Studies I and II (21:086:201 and 202, respectively).
- If a 100- or 200-level course is required to fulfill the degree requirements, and was not taken during the student's associate's degree coursework, then Rutgers University College-Newark will allow students in the program to satisfy the requirement through a Rutgers online course or the use of exchange registration.
- All students are required to complete their last 30 credits as matriculates of Rutgers University College-Newark. The Rutgers University College-Newark residency requirement may be satisfied by taking Rutgers University courses offered by other Rutgers units at the off-campus location. Courses taken as exchange registration do not apply to the residency requirement.

This articulation agreement is intended to serve as a guide for students who want to transfer from County College of Morris to Rutgers, The State University of New Jersey, University College-Newark. As each student is unique, Rutgers University College-Newark will provide students with guidance and information about their individual transfer situation.

Approval of Agreement

This agreement shall be effective for five years from July 1, 2014 to June 30, 2019. To ensure continuity and maintenance of this agreement, it shall be reviewed and updated every five years or as needed when either party makes curricular changes.
