

## **Articulation Agreement**

### **Rutgers University-Newark School of Criminal Justice & County College of Morris**

#### **Purpose**

The purpose of this agreement is to enable students who graduate from County College of Morris with an Associate of Science (A.S.) degree to continue their education and obtain a B.S. in Criminal Justice from Rutgers University-Newark as part of the Rutgers-County College of Morris Partnership in Higher Education off-campus initiative.

#### **Transferring Credits from County College of Morris**

Students completing the A.S. in Criminal Justice degree from County College of Morris may transfer up to 62 credits towards a B.S. in Rutgers University-Newark's Criminal Justice allowing them to complete their Rutgers degree in four years of part-time study. Graduates of other County College of Morris programs will have their transcripts evaluated for necessary lower-level major requirements.

#### **Rutgers University-Newark, School of Criminal Justice Major Requirements**

Rutgers University-Newark's B.S. in Criminal Justice requires a total of 124 credits, a minimum of 41 credits in the Criminal Justice major, 38 credits of Rutgers University-Newark's Core Curriculum, 45 credits of additional courses, including the completion of a minor as specified in Rutgers University-Newark's Core Curriculum, to bring the total to 124 credits. See attached Articulation Degree Plan (Attachment A).

By following County College of Morris' A.S. as defined in the attached Articulation Degree Plan, students can transfer 62 credits to Rutgers University-Newark's Criminal Justice program.

- Courses transferring to School of Criminal Justice at Rutgers University-Newark must have a grade of "C" or better in each course in the major.
- A maximum of 18 credits in Criminal Justice courses may be transferred into the Rutgers University-Newark's Criminal Justice program.
- A minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.0 is required for admission into Rutgers University-Newark's Criminal Justice program. Students with less than a 3.0 will be reviewed on an individual basis.
- Completion of a County College of Morris A.S. degree that is compliant with the Comprehensive Statewide Transfer Agreement will meet the Core Curriculum requirements for Rutgers University-Newark, as stipulated by the Comprehensive Statewide Transfer Agreement.
- Any change in the curriculum of County College of Morris or Rutgers University-Newark's Criminal Justice program will require a review of this agreement by both programs.

**Special Conditions**


- Under the policies of the cooperative agreement, County College of Morris is responsible for providing 100- and 200-level courses and Rutgers University-Newark is responsible for providing the 300- and 400-level courses.
- If a 100- or 200-level course is required to fulfill the degree requirements, and was not taken during the student's associate's degree coursework, then Rutgers University-Newark will allow students in the program to satisfy the requirement through the use of exchange registration.
- All students are required to complete their last 30 credits as matriculates of Rutgers University-Newark. The Rutgers University-Newark residency requirement may be satisfied by taking Rutgers University-Newark courses offered by other Rutgers units at the off-campus location. Courses taken as exchange registration do not apply to the residency requirement.

This articulation agreement is intended to serve as a guide for students who want to transfer from County College of Morris to Rutgers University-Newark. As each student is unique, Rutgers University-Newark will provide students with guidance and information about their individual transfer situation.

**Approval of Agreement**

This agreement shall be effective for five years, from July 1, 2014 to June 30, 2019. To ensure continuity and maintenance of this agreement, it shall be reviewed and updated every five years, or as needed when either party makes curricular changes.


