Additional General Education Requirements

(General Education Electives): Choose 2 courses outside of African, African-American and Caribbean Studies. These courses should be chosen from approved General Education Electives. CCM students can fulfill 2 GE Electives with one CCM Social Science Elective course and the following required CCM course: SOC 102 Social Problems SOC 202 Contemporary Social Issues (Morris).

(Upper Level Electives: 3 courses, 9 credits)

Choose 3 courses outside of African, African-American and Caribbean Studies which are above the 100 level. See WPU website for list of courses from which to choose. Students can use the 2 CCM Free Electives for 2 of the 3 Upper Level Electives. Check the transferability of these courses on www.njtransfer.org or contact an African, African-American and Caribbean Studies Department advisor.

(Non-Western Elective: 1 course, 3 credits)

African, African-American and Caribbean Studies majors may fulfill this requirement with an African, African-American and Caribbean Studies class.

Major Requirements

William Paterson University's major in *African, African-American and Caribbean Studies* requires 36 credits. Up to 9 credits can transfer into the major from County College of Morris with the grade of "C" or higher.
