### *Additional General Education Requirements*

Other G.E. Requirements at WPU include:

- 6 credits of G E Electives—choose 2 courses outside of Geography from General Education electives or from acceptable GE courses. CCM students can fulfill these 2 GE electives with one CCM Social Science Elective course and the following required CCM course: SOC 202: Contemporary Social Issues or SOC 102: Social Problems
- 3 credits in Non-Western—this requirement may be fulfilled by a required course in the Geography major.
- 9 credits in Upper Level electives (any non-major course 200 level or above): Choose 3 courses outside of Geography which are above 100 level. CCM students may choose any of the following courses which are transferable to WPU. See WPU website for list of additional courses from which to choose. Students can use 2 CCM Free Electives for 2 of the 3 Upper-level Electives. Here are recommended options:
