### ***Additional General Education Requirements***

Other G.E. Requirements at WPU include:

*(General Education Electives)*: Choose 2 courses outside of History. These courses should be chosen from approved General Education Electives. CCM students can fulfill 2 GE Electives with one CCM Social Science Elective course and the following required CCM course: **SOC 102** Social Problems **SOC 202** Contemporary Social Issues (Morris).

### ***Major Requirements***

The William Paterson University Department of History requires 12 courses, or 36 credits, for the major. The History Major requires courses in different geographic areas (United States, Europe, and the non-Western world) and at different levels (six 300 level courses, two 400 level courses, and the remaining course can be either 300 or 400 level).

*(History Major Required Courses: 3 courses, 9 credits)*

**HIST 260** Historical Methods (no CMM equivalent);

**HIST 205** U.S. History to Reconstruction (CMM course: **HIS 166** U.S. History I);

**HIST 206** U.S. History Since Reconst. (CMM course: **HIS 167** U.S. History II)

*(History Major Elective Courses: 9 courses, 27 credits)*

**European Electives**: 2 courses, 6 credits (either 300 or 400 level).

**Non-Western Electives**: 2 courses, 6 credits (Asian, Middle Eastern, Latin American History or the Age of Global Connections at either 300 or 400 level)—Note: one non-Western History course will fulfill the non-Western GE Requirement.

**Other History Electives**: 5 courses, 15 credits (in any field and at either level).

**Students can not take more than 18 credits in any field of History.**

A maximum of 18 credits in any field of History may be transferred from **County College of Morris**.
