# Additional General Education Requirements

# Other G.E. Requirements at WPU include:

- 6 credits of G E Electives. If Beginning Spanish I and II are taken for the GE foreign language credit, Intermediate Spanish I and II can count toward these GE electives.
- 3 credits in Non-Western. This requirement can be fulfilled at WPU by some Spanish major elective courses. CCM students should use Diversity requirement to fulfill Race and Gender course
- 9 credits in Upper Level electives (any non-major course 200 level or above): Choose 3 courses outside of Spanish which are above 100 level. CCM's ISA 110 course may transfer as an upper-level GE elective (COMM 340).

### Major Requirements

William Paterson University's major in Spanish requires 33 credits. Up to 15 credits—for courses above the Intermediate level—can transfer into the major in Spanish from County College of Morris with the grade of "C" or higher.
