Special Requirements and comments:

- Directed electives will transfer either as General Education or directed electives—up to 32 credits. Advanced courses will transfer as major courses up to 12 credits. All other courses taken will be credited toward electives.
- William Paterson University's Non-Western requirement will be fulfilled by French and Francophone Studies major course FR 200 Introduction to French and Francophone Literatures and Cultures. CCM students should use Diversity requirement to fulfill Race and Gender course.
- Students transferring to the French and Francophone Studies Program at WPUNJ are expected to complete all 59 credits in General Education required courses.
