CCM BREAKS GROUND FOR ADVANCED MANUFACTURING AND ENGINEERING CENTER

The CCM Board of Trustees, along with the Morris County Board of Chosen Freeholders, regional and state officials, industry leaders, students and faculty, marked the groundbreaking on Wednesday, January 30, for a state-of-the art Advanced Manufacturing and Engineering Center.

About 100 people gathered at CCM to celebrate the plans for the \$11 million center designed to address employment needs and growing industry demands. Funding for the center is being provided by the State of New Jersey, Morris County and private donations. The 31,500-square-foot facility is expected to open spring 2020.

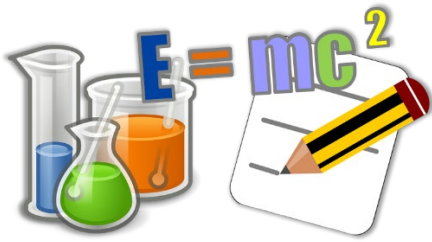

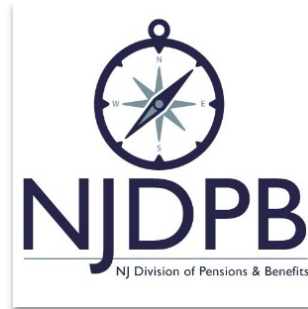

NJ DIVISION OF PENSIONS AND BENEFITS RETIREMENT SEMINAR

On Friday, March 15, at 10 a.m. in Sheffield Hall, Room 100, representatives from the NJDPB will present a seminar for participants in the Public Employees Retirement System (PERS) and the Teachers' Pension and Annuity Fund (TPAF).

The Retirement Planning seminar will take a step-by-step approach to the retirement process and explain what happens after you submit your application. NJDPB explains your benefits, survivor options, group life insurance, loan repayment provisions and the taxability of your pension. There is also a brief discussion of your health benefits coverage in retirement. The classroom session is approximately three hours in duration and will include a Q&A period. 2018 TAX INFORMATION ONLINE

CCM employees can access their 2018 W-2s via Titans Direct. Online W-2s are required by law for county employees. The Payroll department will not be printing and mailing any W-2s. You must first consent on Titans Direct to view/print your W-2. If you have any problems with this process, please do not hesitate to contact the Payroll department.

In accordance with the Affordable Care Act, the 1095-C form will be available by March 31, 2019.
