NJ DIVISION OF PENSIONS AND BENEFITS RETIREMENT SEMINAR

On Friday, March 15, at 10 a.m. in Sheffield Hall, Room 100, representatives from the NJDPB will present a seminar for participants in the Public Employees Retirement System (PERS) and the Teachers' Pension and Annuity Fund (TPAF).

The Retirement Planning seminar will take a step-by-step approach to the retirement process and explain what happens after you submit your application. NJDPB explains your benefits, survivor options, group life insurance, loan repayment provisions, and the taxability of your pension. There is also a brief discussion of your health benefits coverage in retirement. The classroom session is approximately 3 hours in duration and will include a Q&A period. 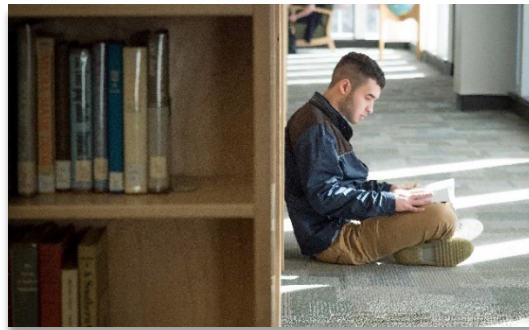
