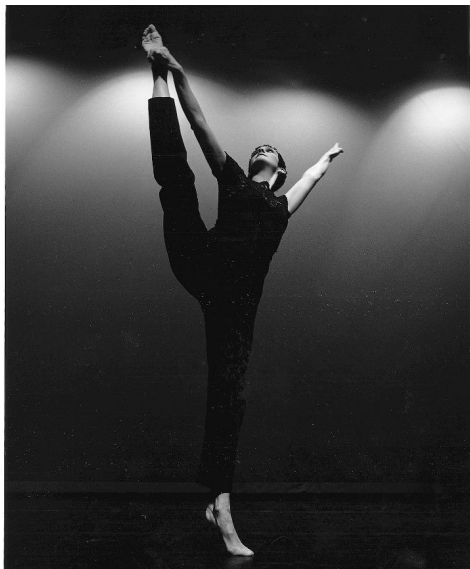

CCM BUGGY ADDS A WEE BIT O'FUN AT ST. PATRICK'S DAY PARADE

This year, the Morristown St. Patrick's Day parade was held on Saturday, March 9. The parade is one of the largest parades in New Jersey with a typical attendance of around 70,000 people. This year, because of the particularly nice weather, officials noted that the attendance was probably even higher. For more than 10 years, the CCM Department of Engineering Technologies and Engineering Science has participated in the parade with its CCM buggy.

The buggy was built by CCM engineering students and is modeled, very roughly, after a 1902 Curved Dash Oldsmobile, one of the first production automobiles. It has a hybrid power-train and can run on either electric or gasoline power. Over the years, many people have ridden in the buggy including CCM students, staff, a local mayor, other politicians, an astronaut and CCM President Tony Iacono. This year Professor Venny Fuentes, department chair; Nial McCabe, retired CCM engineering professor; and Linda McCabe, retired from the CCM Continuing Professional Education department; delighted parade goers with the CCM buggy. As always, the crowd's reaction was a mixture of delight and curiosity. The buggy is available for any form of CCM promotional use. Please contact the engineering department for more information.

CCM ADJUNCT PROFESSOR EXHIBITS ART WORK

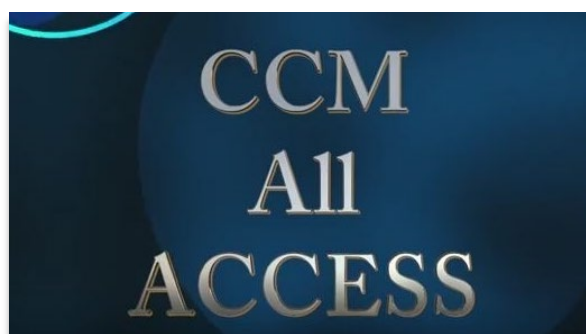
