CCM TRAVEL AND REIMBURSEMENT POLICY

In order to control travel and reimbursement expenditures, CCM adopted the Travel and Reimbursement Policy. Even if a particular expenditure is permitted under this policy, CCM urges you to use your best efforts to minimize the cost of travel by using the most economical mode possible. According to Board Policy, limousines should not be used. Car services and car rentals (other than airport shuttles) should only be used if there is not a more suitable and less expensive means available.

All expense reimbursements must be reconciled with the Accounting department within 10 business days of the last day of the trip. Please see the [Board Policy for Travel and Reimbursement](#) before you make your travel plans or contact the Accounting department for assistance.

NEW WIRELESS NETWORKS AVAILABLE ON CAMPUS

Information Systems has completed testing of the new CCM Wireless Network Infrastructure. Two new wireless networks will be available throughout the campus: Guest and CCM-Wireless.

The first new network is available for anyone visiting CCM who is not an employee or student. This network is called CCM-GUEST. As a secure guest network, CCM-GUEST requires some basic information to get connected. A guest will need a functioning email address and/or a cellular phone number for access. Please note that CCM-GUEST is not considered a secure network.

The second new wireless network is called CCM-Wireless. CCM-Wireless will be live on Monday, April 22. CCM-Wireless is secured through the most up-to-date methods available. All students, staff and faculty will have to sign in once to join their device. Up to five different devices are allowed to be registered for each individual.

Instructions for accessing the network will be posted on the Guest Portal, as well as on the Solution Center website. In conjunction with the new networks, bandwidth has been increased to make uploads and downloads faster.
