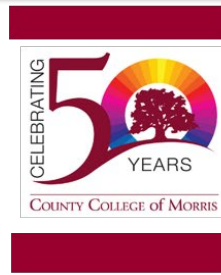

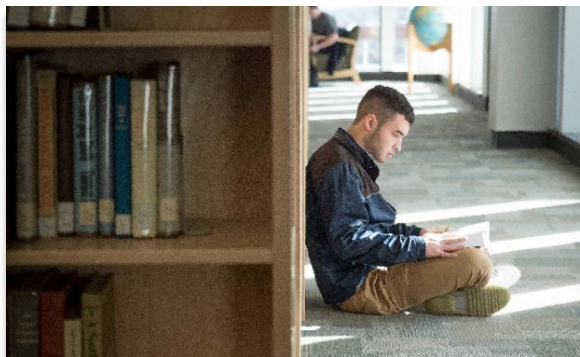

PURCHASING DEADLINES FOR FISCAL YEAR 2018/2019

If you are planning to purchase any capital equipment or promotional printed items, please email the Purchasing department immediately. Purchasing needs to determine if in the aggregate any legal thresholds have been exceeded which would require public advertisement. Capital Items that are available under a state contract or a consortium eliminate the need for public advertisement; therefore, a June 30 delivery may still be achievable.

- Miscellaneous Purchases (excludes repair and maintenance) - 5/10/19
- Blanket Order Change Request - 5/24/19
- WB Mason Office Supplies - 5/31/19

Please make sure there are sufficient funds to support your blanket order increases. Blanket Order Change Requests with insufficient funds will be returned. When processing Blanket Order Releases, please monitor your remaining balance to ensure that your release is not flagged as an "Unauthorized Purchase." All releases must be processed no later than May 31.

Note: All requisitions received by the deadline date will be prioritized and processed accordingly. If your requisition is received after the deadline, it may not be processed because Purchasing cannot guarantee a June 30 delivery.

PUBLIC SAFETY INCREASING ENFORCEMENT OF MOTOR VEHICLE LAWS ON CAMPUS ROADWAYS

The Public Safety Department has received a high volume of speeding and failure to yield to pedestrians in the crosswalks complaints over the past few months. In an effort to increase awareness of the traffic safety laws and monitor the traffic flow on campus, Public Safety officers will increase enforcement of the college's motor vehicle laws on the main roadways.

College Avenue, Campus Drive and Titan Drive are classified as public roadways through the adoption by Randolph Township local ordinance, which also allows Randolph Police officers to enforce the speeding and crosswalk laws concerning State of New Jersey motor vehicle violations (Title 39). The College fines for speeding vary from \$100 to \$225, depending on the speed and number of violations. The pedestrian crosswalk law maintains that vehicles stop for pedestrians entering a crosswalk or in the crosswalk until the pedestrian is out of the crosswalk. Repeat offenders can be handled through the administrative process or the student judicial board review for additional penalties. Offenders issued summonses by Randolph Police will be subjected to State of New Jersey traffic laws and an appearance in Municipal Court may be required.

The Public Safety department is requesting the support of the campus population in maintaining a safe and positive campus climate in all aspects. The college has installed digital speed signs and roadway cameras to help us enforce and investigate all traffic related complaints on campus. Your anticipated support is greatly appreciated.

Her teammate, Gabriel Lukijaniuk, of Hackettstown, won third place in the individual competition. Together, they won first place for the highest-ranking team from a two-year institution.
