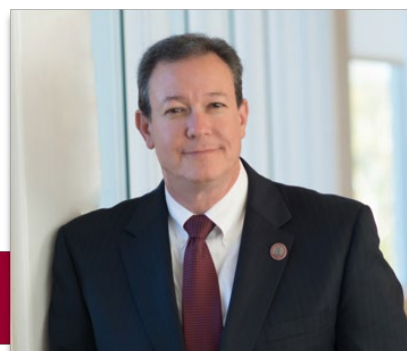


UPCOMING DEPARTMENT MOVES

Keep a lookout for changes on campus. To enhance efficiency, the following moves will take place over the next few months, in the order listed:

- Workforce Development will move to the lower level of the Student Community Center (SCC), Room 125 and across the corridor in the former Student Club offices.
- The Accounting and Institutional Grants departments will move down the corridor to Henderson Hall (HH), Room 210.
- The Vice President of Academic Affairs and the Vice President of the School of Professional Studies/Applied Sciences will move to HH, Room 203.
- The Graphic Designer and Digital Communications Coordinator (webmaster) will relocate to the rear portion of the current Accounting Suite, which will become HH, Room 216.
- The Solution Center will have a satellite office in Cohen Hall, Room 113.
- The student clubs will move to SCC, Room 221 (Magic Rooms) where new walls will replace the folding partitions to create club offices and meeting space.

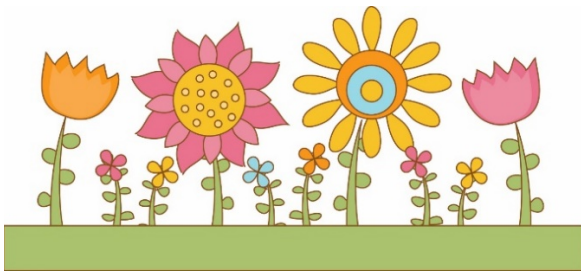

CAREER SERVICES LAUNCHES NEW PROGRAM

This September, Career Services will launch CareerReady, a career readiness initiative to engage campus student workers in the development of their career readiness skills. The initiative has two objectives:

1. Many students start college with no proper work experience, while others are in need of instruction and guidance as to how to be effective workers. By conveying “real-job” expectations, CCM student workers will be better prepared to enter the “real-world” workplace.
2. A college degree, in and of itself, does not automatically lead to a good job. Employers want assurances that candidates have well-developed, and demonstrated workplace competencies. Recognizing and reinforcing these “soft skills,” CCM student-workers can benefit from future job and career successes.

Career Services believes that CCM’s student aide supervisors are well-positioned to positively impact their student workers by making development and growth central to students’ experiences as campus employees. The plan is to introduce CareerReady to campus supervisors in early August. At that time, Career Services will offer strategies and practices to support the efforts to prepare CCM student workers for successful transitions into the workplace.

CCM's scheduling software has been successfully upgraded. 25Live is the calendaring system CCM now uses for scheduling events and classes. This new software provides the college with much more flexibility and cross-functional coordination of its physical spaces than the software it replaced would allow. It also replaces numerous individual departmental calendars that did not afford an overarching single source overview of CCM's conference rooms, special purpose rooms or large public spaces used for hosting events.
