## ENFORCEMENT OF MOTOR VEHICLE LAWS ON CAMPUS ROADWAYS

The Public Safety Department has received a high volume of speeding complaints and failure to yield to pedestrians in the crosswalks over the past few months. In an effort to increase awareness of the traffic safety laws and monitor the traffic flow on campus, the Public Safety Officers will increase enforcement of the College motor vehicle laws on the main roadways.

College Ave, Campus Drive and Titan Drive are classified as public roadways through the adoption by Randolph Township local ordinance which also allows Randolph Police Officers to enforce the speeding and crosswalk laws concerning State of NJ motor vehicle violations (Title 39). The motor vehicle rules and regulations at the campus are primarily enforced by the Public Safety Officers and Public Safety citations are issued. The speed limit on College Avenue is 25 mph, Titan and Campus Drive are 15 mph. and the parking lots are 5 mph. Public Safety Officers utilize handheld speed radar measurement units and the digital speed signs on campus to enforce the College's rules and regulations. The College fines for speeding vary from \$100.00 to \$225.00 depending on the speed and number of violations.

The pedestrian crosswalk law maintains that vehicles stop for pedestrians entering a crosswalk or in the crosswalk until the pedestrian is out of the crosswalk. Repeat offenders can be handled through the administrative process or the student judicial board review for additional penalties. Offenders issued summonses by Randolph Police will be subjected to State of NJ Traffic Laws and an appearance in Municipal Court may be required.

The Public Safety Department is requesting the support of the campus population in maintaining a safe and positive campus climate in all aspects. Your support in helping promote the safe vehicle operation at the campus is very much appreciated. If you see a violation and want to get involved please note the time / date, location, vehicle description, license plate and if possible, description of operator and notify the Public Safety Department. If you want to remain anonymous just inform the Public Safety Dispatcher that you want to remain anonymous. The College has installed the digital speed signs and roadway cameras to help us enforce and investigate all traffic related complaints on campus. Your anticipated support is greatly appreciated.
