Discovering What He Needed to Dream Big

On his way to earning a medical degree with the goal of becoming a physician specializing in trauma medicine, Vincent Franco credits his CCM education for sparking a love of learning he lacked in high school.

"In high school, I was not a strong student so medicine was not something I even considered," recalls Franco, of Montclair. Then at CCM, he took an anatomy and physiology (A&P) course, considered one of the hardest college courses, and discovered he actually excelled at learning. Having mastered A&P and at the urging of several CCM professors he had developed strong relationships with, he decided to pursue pre-med.


