CCM Applauds the Class of 2021

Today, CCM will recognize the accomplishments of more than 1,250 graduates at its 52nd Annual Commencement Ceremony. The CCM community is immensely proud of the graduates from the Class of 2021, who despite a pandemic and all the resulting challenges succeeded in completing their course of study. Also of note is that this is the largest graduating class in the college's history, attesting to the resilience of these individuals, the high-quality education they received and the impact of the strong student support services CCM has in place.

The celebration starts today with a graduation walk, running from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Then at 7:30 p.m., a virtual commencement ceremony will premiere on YouTube. Be sure to tune in at www.ccm.edu/graduation/. This year's keynote speaker is Richard T. Thigpen, Senior Vice President – Corporate Citizenship at PSEG and Chairman of the PSEG Foundation. Thigpen will share his insights and experience as a citizen activist both from his professional life and service to others. At PSEG, he is responsible for business areas that drive public policy through advocacy, charitable activities and corporate social responsibility. He also was a former assistant to the president of the NAACP State Conference for Public Affairs and currently serves on the boards of the New Jersey Climate Change Alliance, the New Jersey Legislative Black Caucus Foundation and the New Jersey Pandemic Relief Fund.

A total of eight students were recognized for completing the Culinary Opportunities Program (COP) Program for Adults with Development Disabilities. This is the third group of students graduating from the COP certificate program designed to prepare adults for work in a variety of food production environments.

Also recognized were four high school students who are completing their second year in the Culinary Arts Share Time (CAST) program. CAST is a new program the college started last year with the Morris County Vocational School District that provides students with the opportunity to earn both their high school diploma and college credits towards a degree in Restaurant and Culinary Management at CCM.

As part of the graduation ceremony, luncheon was served from the college's new "Culinary Café" food trailer that is also the home for the Food Truck Entrepreneur class. The graduation ceremony was held Thursday, May 20, when the Culinary Cafe served up Cuban sandwiches, grilled chicken Caesar salad and cotton candy for dessert to the students and their families, as certificates were presented and guests celebrated the graduates' achievement.
