Blackboard Users



Flu Shot Clinic



CCM will be holding a Flu Shot Clinic on Wednesday, October 19, from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. in Davidson Room D and Thursday, October 27, from noon to 4 p.m. in LRC, Room 121. Employees enrolled in Horizon or Aetna who have OptumRX as their prescription provider can receive a flu shot at no cost. These employees must bring a copy of their medical ID and OptumRX ID card have the \$5 copay waived. Covered family members are also invited to participate in the clinic. For others, the cost is \$5, paid in cash or by check. Credits cards cannot be accepted. The clinic is first come, first served.
