Table of Hope to Hold Drive-Through Thanksgiving Food Distribution Turkeys, Fresh Produce, Canned Goods and More for a Holiday Feast

Helping to make Thanksgiving a meal to remember, Table of Hope will be holding a holiday food distribution event – including turkeys and the fixings – at CCM on Friday, November 18, from 1 - 2:30 p.m.

The drive-through food distribution, open to Morris County residents, takes place in Parking Lot 1.

This is the third year that CCM is hosting a Thanksgiving feast distribution with Table of Hope. Along with turkeys, fresh produce, canned goods and dairy products will be provided for a complete holiday meal. The distribution will operate as a no-questions-asked event with cars stopping at different stations categorized by food type. Visitors only need to open the trunk of their car to have boxes of food placed there by volunteers.


The partnership between Table of Hope, part of the Spring Street Community Development Corporation, and CCM has benefitted the community for several years now. CCM has hosted five previous events with Table of Hope to assist those in need. Sponsoring the Thanksgiving distribution are Alstede Farms, Bethel Church of Morristown, the Community Food Bank of NJ, McRae Capital Management and the Morris County Sheriff's Office.



EOF is collecting shoeboxes packed with small gifts for Operation Christmas Child. The shoeboxes are sent to poor children worldwide.



Mandatory Training

In September, the Board of Trustees resolved to require annual training for all employees and additional training for certain employees with procurement or safety obligations as a part of their position.

Following the training required during initial employment, each year all employees (full-time, part-time and temporary) are required to review and acknowledge receipt of the following policies:

- Data Security (2.2016.1)
- Use of Information (2.009.1)
- Code of Conduct (3.1016)
- Code of Ethics (3.1002)

Earlier this month, you received an email from County College of Morris with the subject line "Vector LMS, Higher Education Edition Online Training" that includes a link to the SafeColleges portal, the college's online employee training vendor. On this site, you will be able to access, read and acknowledge each of these four policies.

The email will include your username. You do not need to provide your training certificates to HR, as it will receive a report from the vendor. Please be aware that non-compliance may result in disciplinary action. The deadline to complete the training is December 9.
