



CCM Athletics Presented with Champions of Character Award Recognized for Excellence in Sportsmanship, Integrity and Community Service



The Athletic Department – from student/athletes and coaches to administration and staff – recently gained additional confirmation of their success with a Champions of Character Award from the National Junior College Athletic Association Region XIX.

The award recognizes outstanding results in the character development of student/athletes and coaches by embracing the five core values of respect, responsibility, integrity, servant leadership and sportsmanship. Additionally, the award recognizes institutions that demonstrate outstanding involvement in the community, which results in positive character development.

"It is such an honor to have our student/athletes, their coaches and the staff who support them recognized with this prestigious award," says Jack Sullivan, director of Athletics at CCM. "The college places a very high emphasis on developing and supporting athletes who succeed both on and off the field, and we're pleased to have Region XIX recognize those efforts."


