CCM Presented with Lithograph of Vietnam Era Plane



In appreciation for hosting the Vietnam Memorial Moving Wall on campus earlier this month, the Air & Space Forces Association New Jersey Chapter presented CCM with a lithograph of a Vietnam War aircraft at a special Tribute Lunch held at the Randolph Diner, Saturday, July 16.

Presenting the gift to CCM President Tony Iacono, Colleen McArdle and Steve Ackerman, Bill Fosina, from the Air & Space Forces Association, praised the college for working with VFW Post 7333 to bring The Moving Wall to Morris County.

"We are honored to have been a part of this," said Iacono. "Thank you for giving us the opportunity to honor our veterans and those who made the ultimate sacrifice."

The Tribute Lunch was hosted by VFW Post 7333 to recognize the many individuals and groups that played a role in bringing The Moving Wall to campus. Certificates of Appreciation were presented to State Senator Anthony Bucco, a representative from Congresswoman Mikie Sherrill's office, Assemblywoman Aura Dunn, County Commissioner Deputy Director John Krickus and other supporters and sponsors, including CCM.

Professor Todd Doney, Art & Design, was commissioned by The Chatham Township Historical Society to create a portrait of William Kondrat to be included on a historical marker outside of the Colony Pool on School Avenue.

The historic marker is dedicated to Kondrat who, in 1933 at the age of 17, headed north in Depression-era America to try out some of the swimming moves that he learned in the Colony Pool. At the Niagara River, just below the falls, he and a friend dove in to cross to the Canadian side.

The friend turned back, but Kondrat persevered, only to get caught in a mighty current, which dragged him toward the deadly whirlpool of rapids. After two hours in the swirling water, he managed to break free and swim to the Canadian side. He is the only person ever to cross the rapids.

The historical marker's unveiling was on Sunday, July 17.

Put Your Employee Benefits to Use with WFD Courses

The start of a new fiscal year is a great time to sharpen your skills through the Center for Workforce Development (WFD). Check out what is being offered this summer and fall.

1. A new grant supported series for July and August is online at www.ccm.edu/workforce/grantsupported/. Invite your family members or friends to participate at no cost – as long as the participant is employed by a New Jersey non-governmental business.
2. The WFD course offerings for Fall 2022 are online at www.ccm.edu/workforce/. A new printed brochure will be available soon.

Employees can be sponsored by their own departments to take WFD classes using their professional development budget. Both forms can be found at www.ccm.edu/humanresources/employee-resources-directory/.

Employees can use their tuition waiver benefit for grant supported training classes, but they need to reach out to cbt@ccm.edu and request a link to register since this doesn't qualify under the grant.

To use the tuition waiver benefit, remember:

- Employees do not pay the tuition amount; they only pay a \$5 fee per course.
- Any employee who wishes to take a noncredit course must get the tuition approved by both the employee's supervisor and HR.
- If this is your first time registering using WFD's new registration system (Elevate), you need to create a new account.
- "Save & Exit" just before the **Payment** tab on the right of the screen.

Upon completion of these steps, the employee should bring their approved tuition waiver form and a check or cash for the fees to the Bursar's office.
