The Moving Wall Arrives at CCM

The Moving Wall, the half-size replica of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial in Washington D.C. in support of VFW Post 7333 of Randolph, other veterans' groups and the community-at-large, is now on campus. The wall arrived yesterday morning accompanied by a motorcade led by Warriors' Watch Riders, which first traveled through Randolph. The wall crossed into New Jersey on Wednesday and traveled to the Marriott Hanover Hotel, accompanied by an escort of motorcycles and other vehicles. The group was welcomed at the hotel by veterans, local fire departments and representatives from CCM. Here is a [video link](#) to see more.

Assembled by a group of volunteers, the wall will be on display at CCM 24 hours a day from today until the morning of Monday, July 11.

VFW Post 7333 of Randolph, which arranged for The Moving Wall to come to campus, has put together a full program of events for today through the closing ceremony on Monday. Some highlights include rifle salutes, a parade, a flyover, a tribute to Gold Star families, the laying of wreaths, the reading of proclamations from local, state and federal officials, and the playing of Taps. All CCM employees and students are welcome to attend at any time, or during one of the special events planned. There will be signs on campus directing visitors to Parking Lot 1 (adjacent to Center Grove Road). Note that on Saturday, during the Grand Opening Wreath Laying Ceremony, CCM Trustee and Vietnam Veteran Paul Licitra will lay a wreath on behalf of CCM. Additional special events (as of today):

Nearly 40 high school students took part in CCM's **GenCyber Camp** this summer, learning coding and about cybersecurity careers. Guest speakers presented topics on community inclusion and emotional empathy.

Workshops offered experiential learning activities that allowed campers to self-reflect and contribute authentically to their teams. Final designs were presented to a panel and all participants concluded that a positive campus climate is directly linked to sense of belonging, support and respect when provided with resources throughout a college community.

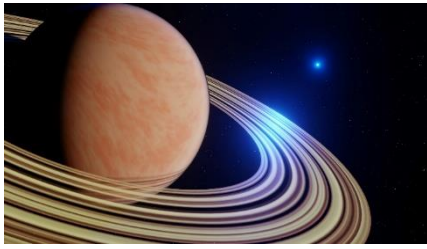
