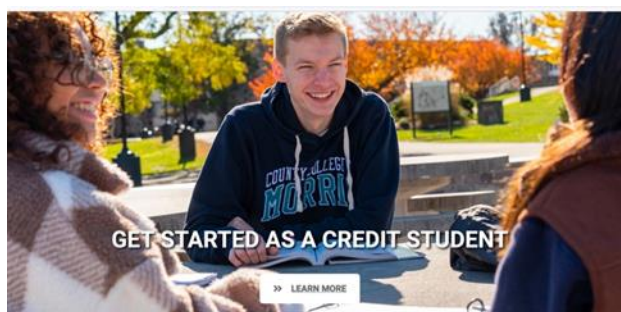

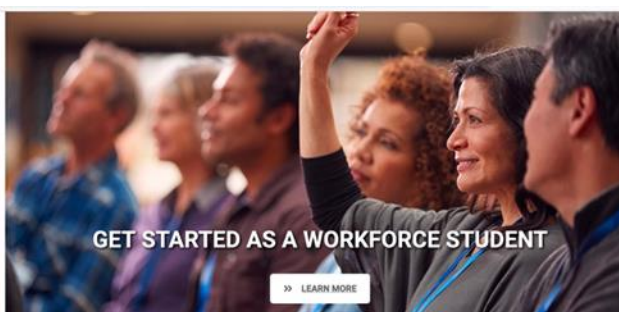

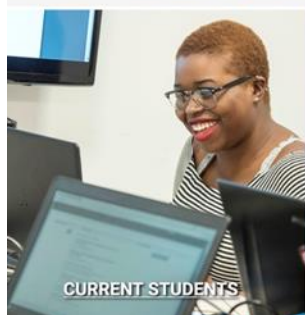

A Streamlined Homepage for the CCM Website

Marketing & Public Relations has streamlined the design of the CCM website homepage to make it easier for students and the college community to navigate, along with updating the look of the site.

For prospective/future students, there are two new buttons and pages: “Get Started as a Credit Student” and “Get Started as a Workforce Student.” The Current Students section also has been visually enlarged and links to a new page with frequently accessed information, including Blackboard and Student Email.

ALL EMPLOYEES, please note the Faculty/Staff link has been **moved**. You can find this link in the hamburger navigation panel on the right side of the homepage and it also is listed at the bottom of the page, enabling the Faculty/Staff link to be accessed from every page on the site. The Faculty/Staff page has not been changed; it contains the same information as before.

In addition, a new “Why Choose CCM” page has been created for prospective/future students.

To improve the menu layout on smaller screens, the "News and Events" link was removed from the main menu at the top of every page and the link for the "Center for Workforce Development" was shortened to "Workforce Development." The Twitter feed also was shortened to make it more visually appealing.

Access Your Documents from Anywhere with OneDrive



As part of the Office 365 suite, OneDrive is a secure cloud storage system you have access to that allows you to upload and retrieve documents and files from anywhere. You no longer need to carry thumb drives or other devices from home or from your office to access your files at different locations. All OneDrive accounts have an extremely large (1 terabyte) amount of storage per user. For users that need more storage than that, Information Systems can easily raise the default limit.
