



COVID-19 Protocol Update

There is currently no public health emergency associated with COVID-19 in New Jersey. As such, there is no longer a requirement for Human Resources or the Office of the Dean of Students to collect vaccination records, require weekly testing, perform contact tracing, report exposures or notify coworkers or the college community when an employee or student tests positive for COVID-19. Effective immediately:

EMPLOYEES

- If you are sick, you should not come to campus. Contact your supervisor to report your illness.
- Requests to work from home must be approved by your Vice President.
- A doctor's note may be required. Please review your union contract or contact Human Resources for more information.

STUDENTS

- Students should review the absence reporting policy in their syllabus for each class.
- Student absences do not need to be reported to the Office of the Dean of Students.

At the last Pandemic Response and Support Team meeting, there was consensus that the college return to pre-pandemic methods for reporting illnesses. As a result, the above changes have been made.

advantage of in-demand emerging careers as certified commercial drone pilots.

Certified drone pilots Kelvin King, Carlos Velasquez, Andrew Flor and Devon Keena teach the course and instruct students in both the practice and theory of piloting commercial drones.

"Drone pilots are in high demand in industries such as photography, real estate, forestry, logistics and distribution, emergency management, surveillance and agriculture," says King, who is also an airline pilot. "This course allows CCM students to be among the first in New Jersey to earn drone pilot certification."

The course is taught in a hybrid mode, combining remote instruction with in-person labs. Classes meet Tuesdays from 6 – 8:30 p.m., and Saturdays from 9 a.m. – noon. Labs take place on Saturday. The cost is \$3,999, which can be broken down into two payments, and students can register at www.ccm.edu/workforce/drone-pilot/. Internship opportunities also are available for those who complete the course.
