The Art Gallery this spring will be offering up the best of the best from the works produced by Visual Arts, Animation, Design and Photography students at the college.

Two Portfolio Class exhibitions have been organized for Art Gallery visitors to explore the creative works of students at the college. The first, the Visual Arts & Animation Portfolio Exhibit opens Thursday, April 13. A reception, free and open to the public, will be held that day at 6 p.m. That exhibition runs until April 26. The second exhibition, the Design & Photography Portfolio Exhibit opens Thursday, April 27. A reception, free and open to the public, will be held that day at 6 p.m. That exhibition runs until May 10.

At CCM, Portfolio classes represent the summation of a student's work from two years of creative studies at the college.

"Our Portfolio classes help students to critique, improve and select their best work; create effective presentations; write documents for marketing their creative work; and develop portfolios to gain entrance to four-year colleges and universities should they wish to pursue a bachelor's degree," notes Todd L. W. Doney, CCM professor of Visual Arts.



Full-Time Employees

Leave balances for full-time employees have been frozen as of February 22nd, 2023. Full-time employees should review their time-sheet balances as of this date and advise HR if you have any discrepancies compared to the time shown in Titan's Direct. If your records match, you do not need to do anything. If you have a discrepancy(ies), please email Donna Barnes in HR at dbarnes@ccm.edu by *Friday, April 7th, 2023*. The email should state the leave plan(s) and the amount of the discrepancy(ies).

As a reminder, employees may carry over vacation days and compensatory time according to their individual contracts and should refer to their respective contract for details. Below is a summary:

AAPF: Vacation Maximum Carryover: Employees hired PRIOR to 5/22/10 can carry over up to 44 days; Employees hired AFTER 5/22/10 may carry forward accrued vacation up to the equivalent of one year of earned vacation.

Comp Time Maximum Carryover: 35/40 hours on June 30. An employee may request permission to use excess hours in July or August.

CCMSA: Vacation Maximum Carryover: Earnings for one year (Accruals vary with years of service).

Comp Time Maximum Carryover: 35/40 hours on June 30. Employees with at least 10 years of continual service may request to use remaining excess hours in July or August.

MANAGEMENT: Vacation Maximum Carryover: Employees hired **PRIOR** to 5/22/10 can carry over up to 44 days; Employees hired AFTER 5/22/10 may carry forward accrued vacation up to the equivalent of one year of earned vacation.

CONFIDENTIAL ADMINISTRATIVE SUPPORT STAFF:

Vacation Maximum Carryover: Earnings for one year (Accruals vary with years of service).

Comp Time Maximum Carryover 35 hours on June 30. Employees with at least 10 years of continual service may request to use excess hours in July or August.

Part-Time Employees

For part-time employees, balances are as of the current pay period and are updated each time payroll is run. Accruals for part-time employees are based on hours worked and accrued each pay period. Therefore, balances are always current and part-time employees do not need to do anything. Part-time employees may carry over up to 40 hours of accrued sick leave into the new fiscal year.


