

### Chaîne des Rôtisseurs Jeunes Chefs Competition

On Sunday, February 25, CCM and the new Culinary and Hospitality Arts Institute of New Jersey hosted their first **Chaîne des Rôtisseurs Jeunes Chefs competition** with the Bailliage Joseph Donon. The contest encourages and promotes the culinary expertise of young chefs under the age of 27 by exposing them to a competitive environment with their peers. The competition offered three of our chefs the opportunity to showcase their talents and creativity in a fair, unbiased and professional forum.

The Chaîne des Rôtisseurs is the world's oldest international gastronomic society, founded in Paris in 1248. It is devoted to preserving the camaraderie and pleasures of the table and to promoting excellence in all areas of the hospitality arts. Each year the society sponsors young chef competitions that attract contestants worldwide, while the Chaîne Foundation provides scholarships for students in these fields.



The Bailliage Joseph Donon is specifically dedicated to students (18 to 35) and professionals to help them develop a community, cultivate a thriving professional network, participate in organizing events, develop interpersonal professional skills and an appreciation for the arts of the table, be it in culinary, wine, service standards and elevated customer experience. The name of our Bailliage pays homage to Chef Joseph Donon, who was an apprentice of Auguste Escoffier and who served as the Chef of the Twombly family at their mansion in Florham, NJ.

The three chefs competing on Sunday–Maynor Cardona-Molina (Dover), Ma'chel Campbell (Morristown) and David Tourso met in the Teaching Kitchen at 7 a.m. Two of the chefs are seniors from our CAST (Culinary Arts Share Time) program where as high school sophomores they applied for scholarships to attend CCM in their junior and senior years and to receive high school and college credit.

A team of ten professional chefs were on hand to supervise and judge the chefs and give feedback on their performance. After three hours of preparation, the chefs began presenting their dishes which included four plates each of appetizer, entrée and dessert all within 45 minutes. The scores were tabulated, the chefs congratulated and Maynor Cardona-Molina was announced as the winner just before the Induction Ceremony for 21 new members of the Bailliage Joseph Donon. The ceremony began at 3 p.m. and was attended by family members, guests and honored Chaine members. The day concluded with a champagne and cider reception with oven-baked



breads, cold salads, assorted cheeses, Chaine celebration cake and flambeed Bananas Foster over freshly made vanilla ice cream.

### Academic Complex Elevators and Third Floor Walkway

The DeMare Hall and the Sheffield Hall elevators are scheduled for the state inspection in the beginning of March. The new elevators will be placed in service once approved by the State of New Jersey. Once approved, starting in the second week of March, the final stage of removing the old elevators and converting them to storage closets and genderneutral restrooms will begin. The demolition of the Cohen Hall Elevator will begin over Spring Break.

There will still be intermittent noise and minor odors throughout the coming months. Public Safety and Plant are continuing to work daily on updating caution and detour signage as the work shifts within the buildings. If you have any concerns, please call Business & Finance at ext. 5012 and they will direct the questions or concerns to the correct department/person.

To keep informed of the construction progress throughout the spring semester, please check the CCMemo for regular updates. We again thank the campus community for their assistance with preparing for the spring construction schedule.

As communicated over the last few years, the completed project will provide much-needed accessibility (ADA) access to the third floors of Cohen, Sheffield and DeMare halls with larger elevator cabs and a connection between the buildings' third floors. The third-floor connections will improve circulation and provide additional options for emergency access. The old elevators and equipment rooms will be converted to fully ADA-compliant gender-neutral (all gender) single-stall restrooms and additional building storage. This project is funded through the College's Chapter 12 appropriation and was approved by Morris County.

### Morris County Vocational School Career Technical Education Center

The crane is on site in Parking Lot 9 and the structural steel installation has begun. As the steel goes up and the retaining wall is waterproofed, the soil stockpile in the parking lot will be used as backfill. The section of Parking Lot 9 near the Tennis Court stairs will remain open for parking and entry/exit. Parking Lot 7 and 8 will also be available for parking of students, faculty and staff. The sidewalk near the fence heading towards the AMEC building from Parking Lot 9 will remain open for use. The new facility will focus on Workforce Development learning opportunities and will operate on a share-time model for high school juniors and seniors. The project expands and supports the partnership between MCVSD and CCM. This project is funded through Securing Our Children's Future Bond Act.



## Coming Soon! Center for Entrepreneurship & Culinary Science

The scope of work includes constructing a 13,000 square foot addition to the Student Community Center (SCC) where the current outdoor patio resides. The infrastructure will house space for the Entrepreneurship program and expand learning space for the Culinary Science programs. The submittal review process is underway. CCM anticipates the construction to commence in the coming weeks. This project is funded through the College's Chapter 12 appropriation.



As always, cover your face when you cough or sneeze and wash your hands frequently with warm soapy water.

As has been the case in the past, even if classes are canceled, faculty may choose to meet with students online, but they should not penalize students who do not have internet access. It is recommended that faculty inform their students in advance of how they will operate in the event of a closure. Faculty should talk to their dean or vice president if they have questions or need additional support.
