CRIMINAL JUSTICE CORE: Students may NOT take CJS 116 and CJS 121 simultaneously. Students are strongly encouraged to complete CJS 121 Criminal Justice Systems, prior to attempting any 200-level CJS course. Students are also encouraged to take CJS 213, Police and the Community, in their final semester.

MATHEMATICS: Choose any Math course from the General Education Course list. If you choose MAT 120 (4 CR) Math for the Liberal Arts, you only need to complete one non-credit introductory Algebra class (if required) as a prerequisite, (MAT 006, MAT 007, or MAT 010- depending upon placement test).
