## MATH/SCIENCE/TECHNOLOGY

MATHEMATICS: You must complete at least one $3 / 4$ credit math course. See attached General Education course list.
SCIENCE: You must select at least one 4 credit laboratory science course. See attached General Education course list. You may wish to choose from the recommendations for non-science majors, marked with an asterisk $\left(^{*}\right)$ on the General Education Course list.

TECHNOLOGY LITERACY (12 CR): If you pass the Technology Literacy Competency Placement test, you are not required to take a Technology course although you may do so if you choose. If you do not pass the test, you must take 1-4 credits of General Education Technology. Select from these courses: CMP 101 (1 CR), CMP 126 (4 CR), CMP 128 (3 CR) or CMP 135 (3 CR).
