***Students must be registered for at least 6 Music credits in order to enroll in Applied Music Primary I – IV.

****All students must pass a theory placement exam or register for MUS 011 Basic Musicianship and MUS 176 Aural Comprehension. All students must receive a grade of “C” or better in MUS 011 in order to register for MUS 117.

It is strongly suggested that in order to broaden your musical background and for future placement and auditions, consider taking the following electives:

- MUS 139 Wind Ensemble
- MUS 201 Jazz Ensemble
- MUS 170 Symphony Orchestra
- MUS 221 Chamber Ensemble
- MUS 148 Chamber Choir IV

Any student who receives a grade of ‘D’ in any music course must repeat the course and is required to see the Music Department Chairperson before registering for their next semester.

Please note: All music majors must register for AMS-Piano (MUS 125 & 126, 225 & 226) unless their primary instrument is piano in which case students must register for AMS-Voice (MUS 109, 110, 209 & 210).

MATHEMATICS: See attached General Education course list. Work closely with your advisor to select the appropriate courses. Students must select at least one 3/4 credit Math course.

SCIENCE: You must select at least one 4 credit laboratory science course. See attached General Education course list. You may wish to choose from the recommendations for non science majors.

TECHNOLOGY LITERACY: If you pass the Technology Literacy Competency Placement test, you are not required to take a Technology course although you may do so if you choose. If you do not pass the test, you must take 1-4 credits of General Education Technology. Select from these courses: CMP 101 (1 CR), CMP 126 (4 CR), CMP 128 (3 CR) or CMP 135 (3 CR).
