If you are planning to transfer contact the institution for admissions requirements.

Teacher Education Core Note:

To enroll and remain in the Teacher Education Program students must maintain a minimum GPA of 3.0.

To enroll in EDU 111 and EDU 211 students must have a minimum GPA of 3.0 and obtain permission from their Academic Track Advisor or the Teacher Education Advisor.

+All developmental Math and English courses (including ESL) must be completed before enrolling in an EDU course. PSY 113 General Psychology is a pre-requisite or co-requisite of EDU 111 Teaching in America.

**Students are required to take either two sequential language courses or two literature courses (see reverse side for Gen. Ed. course selection). For transfer, students who have completed two years of a language in high school must begin at the intermediate level of that language.

++PSY 113 General Psychology and EDU 111 Teaching in America are pre-requisites.

+++PSY 217 Educational Psychology is a pre/co-requisite to EDU 211 Behavior and Observation in Education.

MATH/SCIENCE/TECHNOLOGY

MATHEMATICS: See General Education course list for Math courses.

SCIENCE: See General Education course list for science courses. You must choose at least one 4 credit Laboratory Science elective.

TECHNOLOGY LITERACY: If you pass the Technology Literacy Competency Placement test, you are not required to take a Technology course although you may do so if you choose. If you do not pass the test, you must take 1-4 credits of General Education Technology. Select from these courses: CMP 101 (1 CR), CMP 126 (4 CR), CMP 128 (3 CR) or CMP 135 (3 CR).

HISTORY (6 CR): Students are required to take two sequential history courses. Choose:

HIS 166 Emergence of America US I **and** HIS 167 20th Century US History II

OR

HIS 113 Early Modern Europe **and** HIS 114 Modern Europe

LITERATURE: Select any two survey courses from the following:

ENG 243 World Literary Traditions: Beginnings to 1650

ENG 244 World Literary Traditions: 1650 to present

ENG 246 English Classics from Beowulf to Paradise Lost

ENG 247 Major British Writers of the 19th and 20th Centuries

ENG 249 American Literature from Colonial Era to Civil War

ENG 250 American Literature from Civil War to 20th Century

LANGUAGES: Select any two of the same foreign language courses in sequence.
