TECHNOLOGY LITERACY: If you pass the Technology Literacy Competency Placement test, you are <u>not required</u> to take a Technology course although you may do so if you choose. If you do not pass the test, you must take 1-4 credits of General Education Technology. Select from these courses: CMP 101 (1 CR), CMP 126 (4 CR), CMP 128 (3 CR) or CMP 135 (3 CR).
