MATHEMATICS: Choose a 3/4 credit General Education Math elective from the approved course list.

- If you choose MAT 120, Math for the Liberal Arts, it will require one noncredit Basic Algebra course (passing score on Algebra Accuplacer, ACT, SAT, NJSLA equivalencies or a review of Math courses on the High School transcript – for recent graduates only.
- All other General Education Math classes (besides MAT 120) will require two noncredit Basic and Intermediate Algebra courses (or passing score on Accuplacer Algebra, ACT, SAT, NJSLA equivalencies or a review of Math courses on the High School transcript – for recent graduates only.

CRIMINAL JUSTICE CORE: Students are strongly encouraged to complete CJS 121 Criminal Justice Systems, prior to attempting any 200-level CJS course. Students are also encouraged to take CJS 213, Police and the Community, in their final semester.
