Financial Aid Resources for New Jersey Dreamers

The New Jersey Alternative Financial Aid Application allows NJ Dreamers enrolled in eligible New Jersey colleges and universities to apply for state financial aid.

Who should complete this application?

Complete this application if you are **not** a United States citizen or eligible noncitizen and meet all of the following criteria;

- Attended a New Jersey high school for at least three (3) years
- Graduated from a New Jersey high school **or** received the equivalent of a high school diploma in New Jersey
- Registered for **Selective Service** (male students only)
- Are able to file an affidavit stating that you have filed an application to legalize your immigration status **or** will file an application as soon as you are eligible to do so

New Jersey Financial Aid Deadlines 2022-2023

New Jersey Financial Aid Deadlines for Academic Year 2022-2023

Students who have received state financial aid for AY 2021-22 and want to renew their aid for AY 2022-23 are to meet the following deadlines:

Fall 2022 and Spring 2023

Apr 15 2022 Submit FAFSA

Oct 1 2022 Complete State Record in NJFAMS*
(State tasks, verification, corrections, reevaluations, adding a college, etc...)

Spring 2023 only

Mar 1 2023 Complete State Record in NJFAMS*
March 1 or 30 days from initial notification
(State tasks, verification, corrections, reevaluations, adding a college, etc...)

All high school seniors, first-time college students and students that did not receive state financial aid in AY 2021-22 are to meet the following deadlines:

Fall 2022 and Spring 2023

Sept 15 2022 Submit FAFSA

Oct 1 2022 Complete State Record in NJFAMS*
October 1 or 30 days from initial notification
(State tasks, verification, corrections, reevaluations, adding a college, etc...)

Spring 2023 only

Feb 15 2023 Submit FAFSA

Mar 1 2023 Complete State Record in NJFAMS*
March 1 or 30 days from initial notification
(State tasks, verification, corrections, reevaluations, adding a college, etc...)

New Jersey Dreamers: NJ Dreamers are required to meet the same deadlines as above for Renewal or New Students. In lieu of the FAFSA, however, NJ Dreamers need to complete the NJ Alternative Application for Financial Aid. To access the application now, click [here](#).

The Community College Opportunity Grant is available for Academic Year 2022-2023!

New Jersey students enrolled in any one of the State's 18 county colleges may be eligible for tuition-free college. Students who are enrolled in at least 6 credits per semester in Fall 2022 and/or Spring 2023 and who have an adjusted gross income of \$0 - \$65,000 will be considered for this state grant.

There is no separate application. If you already completed the [FAFSA](#)® or the [NJ Alternative Financial Aid Application](#) for NJ Dreamers, you are automatically being considered for this state aid.

Financial Aid Timeline

- Complete a FAFSA each year (**Available – October 1st**-priority deadline March 1st)
- Receive Electronic Notification –*Communication via student Email*
- Comply with Document Information Requests, i.e. IRS Tax Return Transcripts, Proof of family members etc.
- Aid applied to student's account
- Aid disbursed upon verification of attendance

Aid applicable only to courses required for CCM degree program

Refunds to students issued 5 to 6 weeks after individual mini term has started

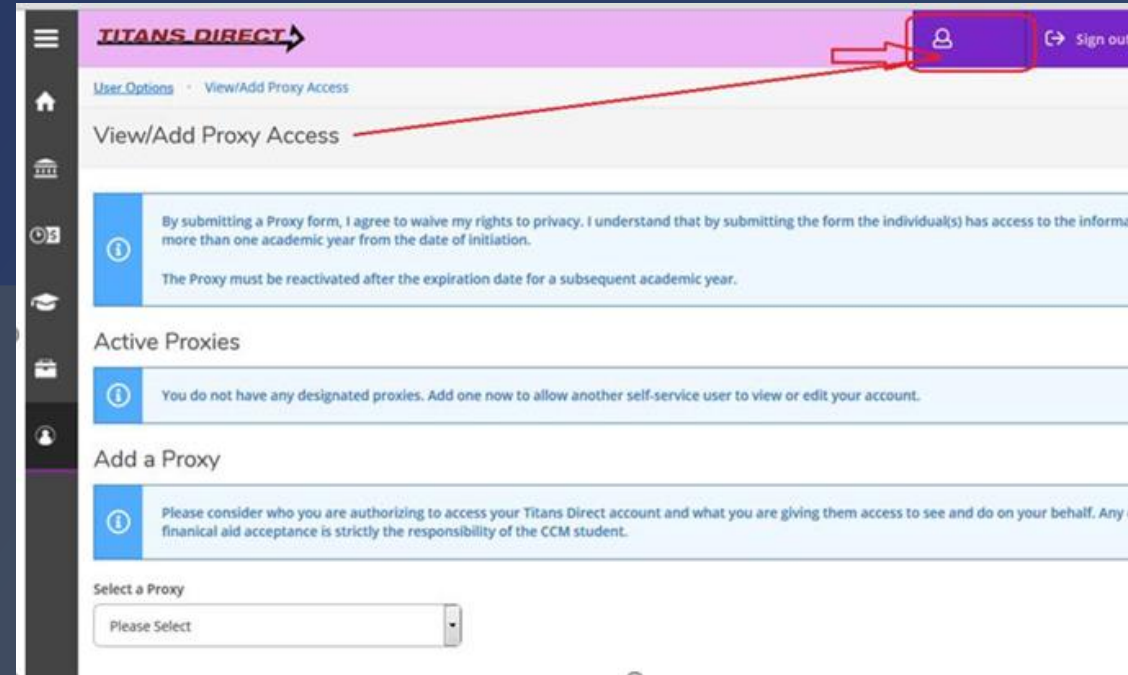
