### CCM Women's Volleyball Wins Region XIX Championship



On Saturday October 30, the CCM Women's Volleyball Team won the Region XIX Division II Championship.

The #2 seeded Lady Titans defeated the #1 seeded Harcum College Bears in Bryn Mawr, PA. The Titans won in five sets advancing to the District Championship on November 6 in Rockville, MD where they will play against Montgomery Rockville Community College on its home court. The winner of this Saturday's District Championship will then advance to the NJCAA National tournament taking place November 18 – 20 in Cedar Rapids, IA.

CCM's Women's Volleyball team has a chance to advance to the NJCAA National Tournament for the first time in our school's history.


