April 20 *The Beat That My Heart Skipped*

In this smashingly stylish reinterpretation of James Toback’s 1978 cult neo-noir *Fingers*, Jacques Audiard has concocted a groundbreaking transformation of a thoroughly American subgenre: the gangster-seeking-redemption film.

Before joining CCM in 1995, she was a corporate liaison with a nonprofit organization, where she developed internships for four year college students by providing opportunities in various fields such as telecommunications, insurance and pharmaceuticals. The EOF program recruits and provides academic and financial support, counseling, and developmental workshops to a targeted group of students who might otherwise not be able to access higher education.

## Changes in Datatel

A recent upgrade in Datatel, which minimizes the possibility of identity theft, now requires all credit card's to be present when students are making payment. As a result, along with continuing to accept cash and check payments at the Bursar office, we will also accept **credit card payments as long as the card is present. We can not accept written credit card numbers.** However, the college does continue to offer students the opportunity to pay on-line with their credit cards which is a much more secure alternative to giving the credit card number to a person.
