Vitale is a member of the Association of Fundraising Professionals and the Association of Healthcare Philanthropy. He has served on the Morris County Chamber of Commerce and was a member of the board of directors of Morris Tomorrow. From 1996 to 1999 he was a member of the Denville Board of Education. He and his wife, Barbara, live in Denville, N.J.

## Driving College Vehicles

In compliance with the Motor Vehicle Use Policy of the Morris County Risk Management Office, any employee who drives a college vehicle must complete a Supplemental Driving Information form, have it signed by their supervisor, and forward it to the Office of the Vice President for Business & Finance, along with a copy of the front and back of their license. Upon receipt of this form a driver's license abstract will be obtained and reviewed by Morris County Risk Management to ensure the license is in good standing. This applies to employees required to drive on a regular basis as well as those who occasionally use one of the college's fleet vehicles. The form must be submitted at least three business days prior to the planned use of the college vehicle and will satisfy current and future vehicle use.
